Finance Committee Report-December 11th, 2018

Dear Church Family,

The Finance Committee and Church Council have approved a working financial plan for 2019. People do not give to budgets; people give less from the head than from the heart. Congregations give to support the church, to needs, to causes and to things that they feel are necessary. Church members realize that there are costs to maintain the building, pay the insurance and utilities. The Finance Committee hopes the plan that has been approved will accurately predict the needs of 2019. We want to thank the Congregation for their commitments to the 2019 ministries. The unrestricted giving for 2019 are 93% of the financial plan for 2019. If you still want to pledge for 2019 please complete a pledge card or call the office and Angela will mail a pledge card to you.

November total for unrestricted giving was \$25,839 with the January through November 2018 total giving of \$334,480. The Year-To-Date unrestricted total giving compared to the annual budget is 74.1% of budget. November total expenses were \$26,965 for a negative \$1,126 for the month. January through November 2018 total expenses were \$398,704 which is 91.7% of the annual budget. That leaves us with a negative \$55,223. However, pledges paid in 2017 towards the 2018 budget reduces that negative total to \$22,682 as of the end of November.

Thank you to the members and friends who have given to the special Thanksgiving offering. Close to \$2,000 was divided equally and donated to the Mahomet Area Youth Club, Helping Hands and the Eastern Illinois Food Bank.

"How Your Gift Can Make a Lasting Difference". The tools explained in this brochure can make a lasting difference in growing our endowments for the future of our church. The congregation's generosity and faithfulness continues to support the work of the church. The reports are always available on request.




