## Sweet Thoughts...

The other day I was reading *Aware Magazine* from Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary in Evanston in Dr. Lallene J. Rector's Presidential Perspective as she was reflecting on the seminary's place in the wake of the 2019 Special General Conference session she shared a statement from a colleague of hers, Dr. Daniel Aleshire:

"Making haste - slowly". Three words that continue to pull at me and challenge me not only as I reflect in my own ministry and life post-General Conference but as I continue to lead with you in ministry and mission here in Mahomet, and everywhere we each are and go.

These three words remind me that as United Methodists we vow at baptism "to renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of your sin"; "to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves"; and not only to "confess Jesus Christ as your Savior ... trust in his grace, and promise to serve him" but to do all this "in union with the church which Christ has opened to people of all ages, nations, and races".

These words and our vows remind me that as people of faith we are called beyond our own selves and not for us, but for the other and their chance to begin a relationship with God in Jesus by the Spirit.

To this I want to remind you again how you've heard me say in worship and at other times that I believe this congregation will continue to be who and whose you are as you reach out to any and all in welcome and inclusion in this family of faith; and that's a good thing.

As we enter into summer there are three things I want to share with you:

First is the Appreciative Inquiry process that our Church Council has asked our fellow member Dave Byers to lead us through as we search for, recognize, and begin again to focus on the best in this congregation as we plan for success in the coming years.

I know that you each and all will not only participate in this process but will continue to walk together into the future that Jesus is calling us all through as we grow, and change, in faith each day.

Next is the upcoming 5th Sunday Camp Meeting All-Church worship and potluck on June 30th. Our Sunday schedule will be different on this day as we have Adult Sunday School at 9:30am, Worship with singing, preaching and new members joining at 10:30am and then the potluck.

Then I want to remind you that while we have pressed "Pause" in the building process for the Family Life Center addition, we are about to press "Play" again and move forward as we together in the Mahomet United Methodist Church are "making haste – slowly".

On the last Sunday of June (6/30), Mahomet UMC will celebrate the Camp Meeting tradition. We want to try to feel the elements which made the meeting something people would travel miles (and often, days) to attend. We will have lots of singing, prayer, praise, and a potluck luncheon to conclude the event. There will be only one service on that Sunday and it will begin at 10:30. The potluck will follow.

The camp meeting tradition began in the light of the religious needs of our pioneer ancestors, especially on the western frontier of the emerging United States, church buildings and services were widely scattered. Circuit Riders were itinerant preachers who took God's word from place to place. The Camp Meeting began as a way of bringing together larger groups of people and often several itinerant preachers (sometimes of more than one denomination) for longer (often several days-long) meetings where preaching, communion, conversion, baptism, and other activities took place.

Francis Asbury, one of the first two Bishops appointed by John Wesley to bring Methodism to America was staunch supporter of camp meetings. The on-line encyclopedia, Wikipedia, has very interesting article on Camp Meetings. Just search Wikipedia for "Camp Meeting" and you'll find it. We hope as many as possible can attend this time of remembrance, praise, and worship. Depending on the weather, some of the activities may be outdoors. So you might want to put a folding chair or two and some blankets in your car to bring along. More details will follow.

"I am delighted that our Children/Youth programming effort (Kick-Off scheduled for VBS), will begin to incorporate on-going opportunities for our youngest to learn about, participate in and gain appreciation for social mission activities. Social mission focuses on making such things as health, food, water, housing, etc. available for those in need. The people and families (direct beneficiaries of social mission efforts) may be local, regional, national, international or of global scope. Those who provide and deliver the social mission programs (like those of us at MUMC) can also benefit in other important ways!

The inaugural social mission activity finds MUMC cooperating with Healing Hands International (HHI), a Christian based Non-Governmental Organization (NGO). Our VBS collective goal is to raise \$500 (which will then be MATCHED by an HHI donor). In this manner, MUMC's VBS effort will generate \$1000 and will be invested to sponsor a HHI Feed A Family For Life Training Program near Mombasa, Kenya.

The Kenyan community is in the process of getting a new clean water source as result of other HHI donors who sponsored the drilling of a borehole (well). The community, with our help, can learn about and employ modern technologies (drip-irrigation and raised-bed food production techniques) to help them feed their families and communities on a sustainable basis! I've known HHI's Director of International Agriculture (Carl Burkybile, retired Paxton/Rantoul High School Agriculture Teacher) for many years and attest to the appropriateness of the methods and techniques incorporated in HHI training programs.

I invite you and your family to find a creative way to support this inaugural Children/Youth social mission initiative as the 2019 VBS strives to generate funds in order to sponsor a workshop that will help a targeted Kenyan community to "Feed A Family For Life".





From the Finance Committee,

March's Unrestricted Giving Income was \$39,745 for our church and expenses were \$35,039 for a net income of \$4,888 for the month.

For the month of April, our Unrestricted Giving Income was \$30,039 and our expenses were \$33,432 for net loss of \$4,888 for the month. Year to date as of April 2019, our Unrestricted Giving income was \$142,130.53 and were expenses are \$134,966.22 leaving a \$7,164.31 net income. The April report is preliminary and will be reviewed by the Finance Committee at our next meeting.

Thank you to the members and friends who have given \$1981 to the special Easter offering. The offering was donated equally to the Mahomet Area Youth Club, Helping Hands and the Good Samaritan Fund.

As always, we are a transparent organization. The reports are always available on request. We thrive as a church because of our congregation's generosity and faithfulness.

## **MUMC** to Conduct an Appreciative Inquiry – Call for Volunteers

As part of MUMC's strategic planning process, Church Council has approved conducting an Appreciative Inquiry (AI). AI is an approach to change that focuses on the strengths of organizations as opposed to shortfalls or problems. The main principle of AI is that every organization has many aspects that work very well, things that give it life when it is most alive, effective, successful, (positive core) and connected in healthy ways to its stakeholders. In other words, people succeed most when they look for what's right, instead of what's wrong

Dave Byers, in his role as Senior Associate Director at the U of I has led 16 Al's and has offered to lead one for MUMC. Dave will lead the team and train them on how to conduct an appreciative inquiry. The Al will involve a few meetings over the course of 4-5 months.

Now all we need are volunteers to be members of the Al Team. The more volunteers we have will make the effort/ time commitment smaller for each Al Team member and provide the opportunity to involve more MUMC members, which will lead to better outcome for our church. Once we have enough volunteers, we will contact you to set a date for our first information meeting.

Once the strengths and aspirations are identified by MUMC members through the AI, a strategic plan can be developed to implement actions in order to transform MUMC to fully realize its potential through connecting to the heartbeat of our church and completely living our collective vision.
