

STAFF PARISH RELATIONS COMMITTEE (SPRC) UPDATE

It's a new year and I want to first say that SPRC appreciates the new members who have joined our team: Jeff Bunting and Laurel Mathews, as well values those who have already been serving: Kari Couch, Terry Dodd, Lin Hambleton, Reba Karr, and Ex-Officio members Rob Parker, Lay Leader and Craig Sweet, Pastor. Gene Larson is our Lay Member of our Annual Conference. Dave Byers is the current chair.

You can think of SPRC as the human resources department for our church. Our role is to help meet the staffing needs of MUMC, which involves creating job descriptions, hiring staff, supporting the minister in his charge, and handling occasional personnel issues that occur. This charge of handling personnel issues requires all SPRC members to keep all conversations confidential so challenges can be handled appropriately and our staff is treated with respect and their privacy is maintained.

For the last two months we have focused on finding a minister to replace Craig Sweet who retires June 30, 2020. The committee first provided some background information through a survey on our church: membership numbers, demographics, programs, outreach, the dynamics of Mahomet, the skills and talents we were looking for in a new minister, etc. This survey was then provided to our District Superintendent, Angie Lee in December. We met with Angie in January to further discuss our needs and provided her with more insight into our church and the type of minister we would like to see at MUMC. We provided a significant amount of information and a primary trait we expressed our new minister must have is an ability to unite people.

Once a minister has been arranged, Angie will call Dave Byers and let him know. Then a meeting will be set so all SPRC can meet the new minister and conduct an interview to confirm that this is the person we feel would best serve MUMC. Once confirmed, we will communicate this news in a variety of ways: our newsletter, church bulletins, and announcements during our services, etc. For Dave, this is the second time going through the process as he was chair when Craig was hired and brought on board in July 2018.

Dave plans to use this experience to help both our church members get to know our new minister as well as successfully transition to a new minister. Part of SPRC's role will also be to help the new minister feel welcomed and get to know MUMC. SPRC feels fortunate that MUMC conducted a recent Appreciative Inquiry (article mentioned in this newsletter) and will be able to share the results with our new minister in order to help him/her better understand our church. More news to come on the transition and thank you all for your support of our staff and minister!

FINANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

This is the season of new beginnings in our church and the Finance Committee wanted to say THANK YOU to everyone who supported the Mahomet United Methodist Church in 2019. We are happy to report that the bills are paid and we have a positive balance in the Operating Fund accounts in the bank as we start the New Year.December Unrestricted Offerings were \$65,376 for our church and total expenses were \$48,958 for a net of \$16,418 for the month.

For 2019, Unrestricted Offerings were \$416,814 and total expenses for the year were \$429,499 for a negative net of \$12,685. Compared to 2018 Unrestricted Offerings were \$411,826 and total expenses for the year were \$431,952 for a negative net of \$20,126.

The Christmas offering came at \$2,232 and will be disbursed to the MAYC, Helping Hands and Habitat for Humanity. Designated offerings totaled \$15,362 for 2019.

The 2019 statements of giving have been sent. If you haven't receive yours please contact the office or email Kay Williams at finsecretary@mumc.org.The congregation's generosity and faithfulness continues to support the work of the church. As always, we are a transparent organization. The reports are always available on request.

Appreciative Inquiry Update

The MUMC AI Team is getting closer to completing their charge of collecting information on the strengths MUMC has in order to determine how to leverage those strengths for driving positive change. As you might recall from previous articles, an Al is a change methodology based on the main principle that every organization has many aspects that work very well, things that give it life when it is most alive, effective, successful, and connected in healthy ways to its stakeholders. In other words, people succeed most when they look for what's right, instead of what's wrong. Dave Byers offered to lead the Al and a call for volunteers was made last summer. Once we had 15 volunteers in the fall of 2019 for the Al Team, the team met to design the interview guide and plan which team members would interview which people who attended MUMC, both members and nonmembers. The Al Team Members are: Chris Bunting, Jeff Bunting, Cindy Dodd, Alice Dollahon, Warren Drake, Valerie Goodwin, Sherri Kenner, Gary Kling, Gene Larson, Rob Parker, Kristina Robinson, Stacy Schroder, Janet Thompson, Gerry White, and Margaret White. Over 80 from MUMC were interviewed and their responses were recorded anonymously so they would feel free to speak their mind in the interviews. The Al Team met on January 18 to assemble all the notes and begin to create a final summary of findings. The team still has a small number of interview notes to collect. Once a final summary is complete, the plan is to share the MUMC AI Final Summary in February with MUMC Council and all in MUMC. The summary will also be shared with the new minister once that decision has been made. Thanks to all of you who were interviewed, The Al Team, and Nancy Strunk who helped with data analysis. It does take a "village" to change our world.
