### **SWEET THOUGHTS**

It simply may be the place I am in my life as retirement comes closer, it may also be that some of the questions that the Bishop asked us clergy who are about to retire, and/or it may simply be a function of spending all this time in the basement over the last 6 weeks. But as I've said in other places, I have been thinking about the similarities and the differences between when I entered ministry after seminary and these times today as we Shelter-in-Place.

One of the differences certainly is the way we are Sheltering-in-Place and working from home as opposed to my daily commutes from where I was living in Madison, New Jersey to the Methodist Hospital in Brooklyn, New York. On the whole it was a 3-hour one-way commute and each day when I'd get on the train, I'd meet people who had already been riding, reading or sleeping for 1-2 hours. I'd walk the 10 minutes or so to get on the New Jersey Transit Erie-Lackawanna commuter train from Madison to Hoboken, then I had to switch to the Path Train and take that into the World Trade Center in lower Manhattan and there switch trains again and take the F Train to Brooklyn, get off at 7th and walk the last 10 min or so to the Hospital. In the evening if I ran, and I don't mean walk faster or jog - ran as fast as I could from the Hospital to the 7th ave station then through the crowds in each of the stations, I could catch a couple of express trains and cut almost an hour and a half off the trip.

This picture was taken in the Hoboken Terminal and I still have that blue jacket, though it is not quite as dark. I remember that I could not really afford to buy a paper each day, but if you paid attention to where you were sitting, someone else would have left one and you could pick it up and read it and then leave it again for someone else or take it with you.



I'd often take the New York Times or the Daily News or the Wall Street Journal into the Hospital with me and share it with the other Chaplains and staff. Which when you think about the way we live today and not just as we Shelter-in-Place, is just another way that life has changed, though it is still life

Which really is the point. Yes, the way we are living in these days has and is changing the way in which we look at and interact with the world around us - but we are still living our faith. We are still called to be the light of Christ shining on the hill, even if we are not gathering in large numbers, even if we are careful about the way we reach out and touch, even if we breathe through masks - we are still Christian. Take the chance of faith and hope and love, reach out and connect with someone today, because you have the chance to make a difference in all the change and life that is happening. The life you lead, leads others ... where are you leading them? Because God in Jesus by the Spirit loves you and everyone else, no matter what; so, take the chance and connect. Enjoy Today! 



How spiritual life leaders at our Illinois Great Rivers Conference children and family serving agencies carry on ministry in this time of physical distancing.

It takes more than a pandemic to stop the ministries for children and families in the Illinois Great Rivers Conference! Each of our agencies is doing their very best to provide new, creative, and safe ways to keep OUR KIDS and their families moving forward with hope and healing.

Rev. Lori Bultemeier, Christian Life Coordinator at The Baby Fold, is also taking care of the staff who work on the front lines with OUR KIDS and families who need The Baby Fold's expertise. What started as weekly prayer and devotion times on each campus has now become regular email "sermonettes" offered to the whole Baby Fold leadership team and staff.

Virtual program staff meetings begin with prayer and words of encouragement offered through Lori's thoughtful and prayerful leadership. Clearly, Jesus will use a "storm" to make His way to us, even walking on rough waves to show us His love. This is an assurance that Lori imparts to the staff, who are then able to be like Jesus as they walk into the storm in the lives of OUR KIDS and their families to offer support and peace.

Thanks be to God for these and all the ways in which our spiritual life ministries continue undeterred in loving OUR KIDS even in the midst of pandemic!

#### FINANCE REPORT

At our April meeting the finance committee discussed the CARES act and in particular the Federal Payroll Protection Program loan. This loan is to provide funds for payroll and utilities for a period of eight weeks. At the end of the eight weeks we can apply for forgiveness for the portion of the loan we used for Payroll and Utilities which will make it a grant. We passed a motion to apply for the payroll protection loan through the Fisher National Bank. We were approved and received the loan on April 16th. This will provide funds to pay for payroll for the next eight weeks. We also discussed three other changes that came out of the CARES Act that you should be aware of:

- Cash Gifts Individuals may deduct \$300 above-the-line. This charitable deduction enables a taxpayer who is one of the 90% who take the standard deduction to also benefit from his or her charitable gifts. The \$300 above-the-line deduction must be gifts of cash by a nonitemizer, and may not be to a donor advised fund or supporting organization.
- 100% Charitable Deduction Limit The usual deduction limit for cash gifts to public charities is 60% of adjusted gross income (AGI). For 2020, gifts of cash to charity (excluding donor advised funds and supporting organizations) are deductible to 100% of AGI. The gift may be for any charitable purpose and is not limited to gifts for Coronavirus relief.
- **Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) Waiver** The RMD is waived for IRA and other qualified retirement plan owners for the year 2020. This provision will permit IRA and other qualified retirement plan owners to retain funds in their IRAs. Because the markets declined substantially after the current RMD was calculated based on the plan value on December 31, 2019, Congress determined that it was beneficial to waive the RMD for 2020. Loyal donors may still wish to use IRA funds to make a qualified charitable distribution (QCD). The QCD is available up to \$100,000 for individuals who are over age 70½.

For the month of March 2020, our Unrestricted Giving Income was \$39,717 and our expenses were \$35,196 for net income of \$4,521 for the month of March. Year to date as of March 2020, our Unrestricted Giving income was \$103,398 and our expenses were 105,816 leaving a \$1,878 net loss. Last year January through March unrestricted total giving was \$112,090 and total expenses were \$101,533 for a net income of \$10,557.

The 2019 conference annual audit form has been submitted. Thanks to Kay Williams, Sherri Kenner-Orenic and Pastor Craig Sweet for coming in on a Saturday and completing the audit.Remember you can go to our website and click the blue button at the top of the page to set up an account for giving once or a recurring giving. Click on the link and enter your cardholder name and credit or debit information. Once your registration is complete you will receive text verification and a receipt. For future giving, simply send a text with the amount you wish to give, and it will process automatically. Or send your check to the Church office at 1302 E South Mahomet Rd, Mahomet IL 61853. As always, we are a transparent organization. The reports are always available on request. We thrive as a church because of our congregation's generosity and faithfulness.
