### From John,

This may sound silly or redundant, but please humor me; I think we ought to have Easter resolutions. What can we change? What will be new for us after Easter?

It makes sense. Springtime really is a time of new beginnings. One of my favorite people said, "I love flowers and baseball, so I like this time of year. " For baseball fans it's a new season, for gardeners, new growth. For farmers it's the planting season. There is "spring" cleaning. There's a change in wardrobe.

With Springtime, the new energy of the season and the momentum of new beginnings: it makes sense to start anew with Easter resolutions. This is complicated by the end of Lenten disciplines. Some ought to end and some ought to continue. A friend had given up a certain fast food chain for Lent. Now seeing how it helped, she moved to giving up all fast food. Those who care about her are encouraging her and celebrating her healthier life. It is an Easter resolution.

What comes to mind are the wonderful lyrics of Brian Wren's hymn, "This Is a Day New Beginnings":

"This is a day of new beginnings, time to remember and move on, time to believe what love is bringing, laying to rest the pain that's gone.

For by the life and death of Jesus, God's mighty Spirit, now as then, can make for us a world of difference, as faith and hope are born again.

Then let us, with the Spirit's daring, step from the past and leave behind our disappointments, guilt, and grieving, seeking new paths, and sure to find.

Christ is alive, and goes before us to show and share what love can do. This is the day of new beginnings; Our God is making all things new."

Are we seeking to live as Easter people? Those who know that death has been left behind?

In Handel's "Messiah", the "Hallelujah Chorus" he writes and we sing , "The Lord God omnipotent reigneth," not any Ceasar, governor, ruler, emperor, no person but God. Fear is not the ultimate power, love is. The love of God conquers all betrayal, corruption, injustice, pain, and death.

That should profoundly shape how we live as post-Easter people. We are invited to live with the excitement of Easter, the hope of Easter, the sense of fresh, new beginnings as forgiven people, in a state of grace.

I don't have much for the specifics of Easter resolutions, but I know the virtues; being hopeful, renewed, faithful, forgiven and forgiving, and encouraged. For me, I want to be excited about God's presence and power in the world. I want to celebrate every new thing. I want to be a different and better person, because of Jesus' resurrection and Ascension.

Please hear the invitation to days of new beginnings.

Some thoughts on The Lord's Prayer

It's a simple, direct, and comprehensive. I've found myself using it with great sincerity when a plane I'm on is landing. The Lord's prayer is beautiful in it's simplicity and completeness. It's easy and accessible. Everyone can use it and feel the connection to God that Jesus intends.

Jesus' disciples had asked about praying and this is what He taught them. As recorded in the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 6 and in Luke 11, Jesus intent was for this to be a central piece of or faith. It is one of the primary legacies of the Gospel and universal in use.

Most of us have the Lord's Prayer memorized to the point of rote. We recite it automatically, perhaps too much so. At times it seems like we repeat it as something to get through, as an obligatory part of services.

There are words and phrases that should cause us to pause. Let's consider using this as a regular part of our spiritual life (not just when the plane is landing) with pause to dwell on each phrase, stop, consider these words, and their meaning.

Let's be engaged by the Lord's Prayer n meaningful ways. Perhaps we need to pray one phrase, pause, consider, then pray it again for more engagement. Jesus said, "Pray then in this way. Our Father, who art in heaven, ...."

### From the Finance Committee

February's unrestricted revenue was \$23,910 for our church and unrestricted expenses were \$33,171 for a net minus of -\$9,261 for the month. Year to date for end of Feb the net revenue was \$63,067 with expenses of \$67,220 for a net of -\$4,153 at the end of February.

However, keep in mind that we had some weather issues in February that affected attendance. We also replaced the church's ten year old copier in February. Hopefully this one will last another ten years but the payment was made in full at the time of purchase. So between the copier and the weather a negative net income for February is not an unexpected result.

Click on the link and enter your cardholder name and credit or debit information. Once your registration is complete you will receive text verification and a receipt. For future giving, simply send a text with the amount you wish to give, and it will process automatically.
