From John,

It is certainly an unusual year. Ash Wednesday is also Valentine's Day (February 14.) Easter is April 1. Regardless of that curiosity, the Lenten Season begins with Ash Wednesday and ends on Easter. Traditionally the season of Lent is a time of preparation, a time to make ready for the Risen Lord. In years past, churches would be emptied out their furnishings on Good Friday, receive a thorough cleaning, and been whitewashed as preparation for Easter.

Many people give up something for Lent, honoring the tradition of fasting and sacrifice. If you choose to give up something for Lent, emphasize the idea of being the master of oneself and one's habits. Try to avoid a sense of being deprived. I am not sure of the value of giving something up for forty days, felling deprived, and then overindulging in what one felt deprived of.

For the early Christian church Lent was a time of preparation for new disciples to be baptized on Easter. It was also a time of reconciliation and reclaiming damaged relationships. There would be a great deal of preparation for Easter, the holiest day of the Christian year.

A friend of mine claims that I use my truck as a storage unit. (It does currently have a pair of boots, a blanket, coffee cups, a fly fishing rod, three sets of gloves, two sets of riding chaps, and a Bible in it.) To make room for a passenger, I go to the truck first to empty it out to make room for said passenger (who will also acquire some English Setter hair for their clothing.)

Most of us can relate to the sequence of cleaning and preparation for guests to our homes. Perhaps this is similar to the internal cleaning we can do to make ready for the great event of Easter, to make room for the Risen Lord in our lives. Where do we need to empty out and clean? Is it anger, grudges, guilt, shame, jealousy, or misguided motives? Do we need to re-order our priorities, to re-focus our lives?

The invitation is to make February 14 to April 1st a time of preparation and growth. Maybe we refrain from some things. More so, let us add the disciplines of faith. Consider a daily Bible reading, or devotional reading, add an extra amount of time in prayer, make a commitment to

some deeds that are the good works of faith. Replace a habit that wastes time with time with loved ones.

Write letters that reconnect and affirm people. When in the presence of loved ones be really present.

So in considering ways to make this Lenten season a time of preparation for the great Good News of Easter, add the positive and constructive habits that build faith.

May this be a time of growth and change for you in faith.

IN APPRECIATION

Each January we receive a statement of monies sent to the larger church through the conference treasurer. What are called "Conference Claims" or "Apportionments" is the set amount we send in each year to support the Illinois Great Rivers Annual Conference and its ministries. These are assigned based on our yearly spending, excluding money sent to missions. They are not based on membership. It is not a head tax. It hasn't been so for years. Still sometimes I get asked if it is based on membership and shouldn't we clean the membership rolls.

Part of this goes to support the cost of administration for our conference. A significant amount goes to ministries that are supported by our churches, collectively. The ministries that get support include children's homes, our campus ministries, and our camping program. Good work is being done in the name of Jesus Christ through our conference claims.

What I want to thank you for is your generosity in supporting relief efforts and ministries above and beyond what is assessed. Those receiving your gifts include, disaster relief through UMCOR, Midwest Missions Distribution Center, the food pantry at the U of I Wesley Foundation, Healthy Start through the Baby Fold, the ministries and scholarships supported by special offerings, Helping Hands and MAYC.

From the Finance Committee

Dear Church Family,

This is the season of new beginnings in our church and the Finance Committee wanted to say THANK YOU for an excellent December and 2017.

December unrestricted revenue was \$119,920 for our church and total expenses were \$37,369 for a net of \$82,551 for the month. Some of December's revenue were 2018 pledged giving's in advance.

For 2017, unrestricted revenue was \$508,209 versus expenses of \$398,770 for a net positive outcome of \$109,439. The Christmas offering came in just under \$2,000 and will be disbursed to the designated charities. Overall, a very positive conclusion to the year.

As always, we are a transparent organization. The reports are always available on request. We thrive as a church because of our congregation's generosity and faithfulness.

February Worship Services

Sunday, February 4 is Holy Communion. The scriptures are Isaiah 40:21-31 and Mark 1: 29-39. The sermon title is "Everyone Is Searching'. After teaching with authority and healing people, Jesus takes time to be alone. Followers come looking for Him. What is it that they want or need? What have they found in this Jesus of Nazareth?

Sunday, February 11 is Transfiguration Sunday. The scriptures are 2 Corinthians 4: 3-6 and Mark 9:2-9. The sermon title is "God Wants Us, All of Us!" Gene Larson is preaching. We will have an opportunity to hear the kind of message that Gene brings to worship services at Bridal Brook. He leads worship there about twice a month.

Ash Wednesday, is February 14. The service is at 7 pm. This service begins the Lenten Season. The scripture passages are Psalm 51, Joel 2: 1-2, 12-17, and Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21. The sermon title is "From the Ashes".

February 18 is the First Sunday of Lent. The scriptures are Genesis 9: 8-17 and Mark 1: 9-15. The sermon title is "God's Plan for humanity". The Genesis passage is on God's covenant symbolized by the rainbow. The Mark passage tells of the beginning of Jesus' ministry. What of God's intention can we gather from these passages?

Sunday, February 25 has the scripture readings from Romans 4: 13-25 and Mark 8: 31-38. The sermon title is "Will Your Soul Thrive?" What choices and priorities keep our souls healthy?

In the upcoming months, we will be preparing the church pictorial directory for 2018. We will need your help with this project as move forward.








