From John,

This year Easter is April 1, a day we usually designate as "April Fools' Day". What should we make of that? Is Easter foolishness? The Common Lectionary assigns this passage for March 4, 2018; "For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written, "I destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart." Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of the age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world?

For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength." 1 Corinthians 1: 18-25

I have long considered wisdom something to be acquired and hoped to be considered wise. Not for status, but for the sake of living well. The thinking is that wise people make fewer mistakes and suffer less grief and stress.

In the Old Testament book of Proverbs, the reader is encouraged to be attentive to wisdom and pursue understanding. The foolish are mocked, "a babbling fool will come to ruin." Proverbs 10:8 and "The wise will inherit honor, but the stubborn fools, disgrace." Proverbs 3:35

So which is it, the wisdom of Proverbs or the foolishness of 1 Corinthians? We receive a clue in Proverbs 9: 10, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight."

It is a humble and practical wisdom that Proverbs advocates. In 1 Corinthians, Paul is challenging the arrogant "wise" who would posture themselves as superior. A wisdom that is not humble and practical is not really wise. Most of us have been exposed to the "wiser and smarter than you" people that serve a need to be superior. Some come to elevate wisdom, the intellect, or even their mind to a god. Truthfully, who is better off, a simple person of

whole hearted faith or a person of noted intellect who wrestles mightily with unreconciled doubt? What a curse to let the mind get in the way of the heart's desire to believe.

Paul challenges the wisdom of the day. God's ways will always be beyond us. The will always be some mystery around God and in our reaching for faith. No argument or logic absolutely proves or disproves the existence of God. In the end we look at all the evidence of a creating God, a loving God, a redeeming God of the Resurrection, and we take a leap of faith. We let ourselves follow our instincts and believe. It is not wisdom. It is not foolishness. It is not understanding. It is love. Love God who loves you.

We ended the year with a surplus and no indebtedness. Thank you to the members and friends who have given life and health to our church with their faithfulness.


We are a transparent not-for-profit and, as always, our financial reports are available for the asking.

"Eggs"alent Easter Recipes



Easter Egg Fruit Pizza

A festive Easter egg sugar cookie fruit "pizza" with strawberry cream cheese frosting. You can make it super simple with a sugar cookie mix or make it from scratch.

Ingredients

1 pouch (1lb 1.5oz) sugar cookie mix (or your favorite "from scratch" recipe)

½ cup (1 stick) unsalted butter, softened

1 egg

4 oz (1/2 brick) cream cheese, softened

1 Tablespoon powdered sugar

¼ teaspoon vanilla

½ cup strawberries, chopped

approx. 3 cups fruit cut into pieces (I used strawberries, raspberries, blueberries, kiwi, grapes, and blackberries)

Instructions

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees and grease a 13" pizza pan and set aside.

In a medium bowl, add the cookie mix, melted butter, and egg and mix with a spoon until a soft dough forms.

Press the dough evenly onto the pan.

Bake for 10-15 minutes or until golden brown. Let it cool completely, about 45 minutes. Cut into an egg shape (I just used a butter knife).

In a food processor or blender, add the softened cream cheese, ½ cup chopped strawberries, powdered sugar, and vanilla and pulse until fully combined and smooth.

Spread the cream cheese mixture onto the cooled cookie.

Decorate with the cut up fruit.

Slice with a pizza cutter & serve.

Traditional Hot Cross Buns Recipe

INGREDIENTS

- 2 packages (1/4 ounce each) active dry yeast
- 2 cups warm whole milk (110° to 115°)
- 2 large eggs
- 1/3 cup butter, softened
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1-1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground allspice
- 6 to 7 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup dried currants& 1/2 cup raisins
- 1 large egg yolk
- 2 tablespoons water
- ICING:
- 1-1/2 cups confectioners' sugar & 4 to 6 teaspoons whole milk
- In a small bowl, dissolve yeast in warm milk. In a large bowl, combine eggs, butter, sugar, salt, spices, yeast mixture and 3 cups flour; beat on medium speed until smooth. Stir in currants, raisins and enough remaining flour to form a soft dough (dough will be sticky).
- Turn onto a floured surface; knead until dough is smooth and elastic, about 6-8 minutes. Place in a greased bowl, turning once to grease the top. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise in a warm place until doubled, about 1 hour.
- 3. Punch down dough. Turn onto a lightly floured surface; divide and shape into 30 balls. Place 2 in. apart on greased baking sheets. Cover with kitchen towels; let rise in a warm place until doubled, 30-45 minutes. Preheat oven to 375°.
- 4. Using a sharp knife, cut a cross on top of each bun. In a small bowl, whisk egg yolk and water; brush over tops. Bake for 15-20 minutes or until golden brown. Remove from pans to wire racks to cool slightly.

For icing, in a small bowl, mix confectioners' sugar and enough milk to reach desired consistency. Pipe a cross on top of each bun.
