From the Finance Committee,

The Finance Committee is pleased to announce that 2018 Consecration Sunday Celebration will be held on October 21st with Dick Livesay serving as the Chairman for the 2018 Celebration. Rick Swearingen and Kay Williams have agreed to assist Dick prepare the 2018 Consecration Sunday Celebration. The Finance Committee has been reviewing possible changes (see the announcement in this newsletter) and Dick will be contacting church members asking for assistance with a number of activities to make the 2018 Celebration a successful day. July unrestricted total income was \$32,365 for our church and total expenses were \$34,421 for a negative \$2,055 for the month. January through July 2018 unrestricted total income was \$220,159 and total expenses were \$252,111 for a negative \$31,952. After we take in to account that \$35,550 of the 2018 pledges were paid in 2017 and if we average them monthly for the year, it would essentially be a negative \$11,214 net as of the end of July. Last year January through July 2017 unrestricted total income was \$240,360 and total expenses were \$236,482 for a net of \$3,878.

As always, we are a transparent organization. The reports are always available on request. We thrive as a church because of our congregation's generosity and faithfulness.

Consecration Sunday is Coming October 21, 2018 "Growing on the Foundation of Our Past"

Dear Mahomet United Methodist Church Family,

Your Consecration Sunday Team is pleased to announce that our congregation's Consecration Sunday will be October 21, 2018. There will be one service on October 21, with Sunday School prior to the worship service and a Celebration Luncheon following the worship service. The Luncheon will be a catered meal and not be a standard fellowship dinner or potluck prepared by fellow church members. The committee wishes for everyone to enjoy our Celebration Luncheon together.

Your Consecration Sunday Team has elected to continue using the Consecration Sunday Stewardship program with the addition of the celebration of our church's history and mission statement. The program develops the need of the giver to give for his or her spiritual development rather than the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who pay dues, we will treat people as our Mission indicates "To lead people to Jesus and help them grow as Disciples". Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in a response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

In the summer she stewed herbs for her mother, a midwife and healer, and in the winter she salvaged metal in her father's junkyard. Her father distrusted the medical establishment, so Tara never saw a doctor or nurse. Gashes and concussions, even burns from explosions, were all treated at home with herbalism.



From the Parish Nurse

Medications Take Back Project:

Our parish nurse Eileen Waters will be collecting expired and unused prescription medications and over-the-counter drugs at the church Sunday, October 14 between services. This one day medications take-back project will provide a no-cost anonymous collection of unwanted and expired medicines. This is the safest and most responsible way to dispose of unwanted and expired medicines to protect your family and to protect our waters.

Guidelines

- Medications are to be left in their containers with labels removed or information crossed out
- No aerosols or nebulizers
- Please do not dispose of medications in the trash or by flushing down the toilet.
- The University Police Department will dispose of the medications



It's a great time to clean out your medicine cabinet! Medicines in the home are a leading cause of accidental poisoning, and flushed or trashed medicines can end up polluting our waters. Rates of prescription drug abuse are alarmingly high—over half of teens abusing medicines get them from a family member or friend, including the home medicine cabinet, and often without their knowledge. The use of these abused prescriptions sometimes leads to the desire for cheaper more accessible street drugs like heroin.

Americans currently abuse prescription drugs more than the number of those using cocaine, hallucinogens, heroin, and inhalants combined.

The Summer Lunch Program at Candlewood

Food insecurity is a major problem in the United States but many don't realize how close this crisis is to home. Current statistics, as quoted by the Feeding America Charity, show that 42.2 million Americans live in a food insecure household, including more than 13 million children. According to data provided by Map the Meal Gap, in the state of Illinois, Champaign County ranks 5th on the list of counties with the HIGHEST number of food insecure individuals. Champaign County is significantly higher than Cook County, and only slightly less than St. Clair County. It is heartbreaking to think that there are so many in our community who are unsure where their next meal will come from or worse yet, if there will be a meal. The Summer Lunch Program at Candlewood was created to help combat the ever-growing number of those who are food insecure in Mahomet and the surrounding community.

Every meal provided is free of cost and no questions asked. This program serves EVERYONE, not just residents of Candlewood and is supported by many of the local churches and businesses in Mahomet. Different organizations volunteer for a week over the summer, where they bring food and dessert to the pool house and simply serve their community. What is truly amazing about this program is witnessing God spread his word through the actions of many. He is bringing together different groups and beliefs, all of which are setting aside their differences and working together for the greater good of the community. Many don't realize that a job loss or medical crisis is all it takes for someone you might know to suffer. Seniors, children, rural communities, and big cities are all vulnerable. The Summer Lunch program, especially while school is out of session, helps provide to those in need of a nutritious meal, nourishment and most importantly, relief. Relief from the fear of hunger for a senior, a family, or a youth.

In 2018, this program served a total of 3,606 meals over a period of 10 weeks. This is an average of 360 meals per week. There were 10 churches involved in this program. MUMC served 383 meals and averaged 7 volunteers per day, plus many more who provided desserts.

We aren't able to thank every one who supports this important ministry but please know whether you help serve, clean up, donate baked goods, or simply say a prayer, you make a difference.
