Sweet Thoughts...

Wow, can you believe it! May Day, May Day, May Day ... Spring is trying to spring up and the year is almost half gone! Which makes me wonder: "How comprehensive is your budget" ... or to ask it another way, "How inclusive is your stewardship"?

Think about it, does your budget only include financial items, and just how much of your life and choices and focus is beyond the reach of your finances? So, have you included your various legal documents like your will, power of attorney, trusts, deeds or mortgage(s) and what about your medical or life or auto or house insurance or if you are or will be turning 70.5 your "Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA in your budget? Does it include not just your financial pledge to the general fund and the building fund here at the Mahomet United Methodist Church, but also your attendance at worship or even your membership or your volunteer work to make coffee or help with worship or serve as an elected spiritual leader of this congregation? Does your budget also include your mission commitments and charitable work in other not-for-profits in our community and area? Does your budget include your prayer time and chances for learning both more about your faith and the world around you? So, "How comprehensive is your budget, how inclusive is your stewardship?" and what are you going to be doing with and about it as 2019 continues?

I also want to lift up a couple of things in the newsletter this month: the first is "My Commitment to Serve" which comes in preparation of the Nominations Committee's work this summer for 2020 and for your stewardship as members and attenders here at the Mahomet United Methodist Church. The second is somewhat similar as I am offering "Pizza with the Pastor" as a time to talk about what it

takes/means to be a member of this congregation on Tuesday evening, May 21 at 5:30pm.

And as we worship and live our faith in these Great 50 Days of Easter for 2019 I thought I'd share with you something from Bishop Gerald Kennedy that continues to speak to me about the power of Jesus Christ as I live my faith today:


At the center of the Christian faith, there is the resurrection of Jesus. ... Those early Christians knew that the heart of their message was an announcement that the power of God has raised Christ from the dead. Admittedly, they did not know just what happened and some of their accounts seem confused. They could not find the precise words to express it and they fell back on symbolism to suggest their meanings. But the central truth of the experience they never doubted and they made it the center of their message. Christians can never explain the resurrection because it is the resurrection that explains us. Rationalistic interpreters of Christianity can never find reasons convincing enough to be substituted for the resurrection. Their logic always has a gap in it. The whole Christian movement demands the resurrection in order to account for it. It is much more of a strain on our credulity to believe that our Lord was raised from the dead. I am frank to confess that I do not know the details of what happened on the third day. But I have been driven by the inadequacy of all other explanations, to believe that the Gospel which I have been called to proclaim, is rooted in Jesus Christ's victory over death.

Herman Keizer Jr., Pamela Lightsey, and Camilo
Maya – who reveal their experiences of moral
injury and how they have learned to live with it.
Soul Repair will help veterans, their families,
members of their communities, and clergy under-
stand the impact of war on the consciences of

conscience in society, and restore veterans to
civilian life.

The financial statement was not complete when the finance committee met in April. Jan Guthrie did report a preliminary operating net income for March 2019 of \$4,575.26 and Operating net income year-to-date \$10,427.40

Kay Williams handed out 2018/2019 YTD comparison Giving Reports in absence of the March Finance report. January through March 2019 Pledge giving was \$91,097 and Non-Pledge giving \$18,314. The same period in 2018 Pledge giving was \$73,979 and Non-Pledge giving \$9,471. A very generous start for the first quarter of 2019.

A reminder that the Finance Committee has moved our meeting time and day from the 2nd Tuesday of the Month to the 2nd Thursday at 6:00pm before the 7:00 Church Council Meeting. This move is to improve communication between the two committees.






