40 Days of God on the Move

As we order our days, we have the gift of different seasons. Some people love winter and the coziness of fireplaces and hot chocolate. Others enjoy the newness of spring or summer's warmth. Perhaps you prefer the crispness of fall. Each season has its purpose.

The Christian life has a similar orderliness of seasons. Christmas and Easter are fairly familiar yearly celebrations. Some people add the celebration of Pentecost, the celebration of the holy spirit and new church. As we approach Christmas, we call it the season of Advent. As we approach Easter, we call the 40 days (plus Sundays) prior as a season of Lent. Lent is an opportunity for us to engage in spiritual practices, preparing us for new life in Christ.

This year, we are going to experience Lent as a way for God to Move in our lives, our community and our world. During these 40 days, starting Wednesday, February 17, we have prepared a God on the Move box. Inside you will have items to help you along the way. Some events will be in person, a rice meal mission project, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday event, and Easter celebration, including a sunrise service.

Some spiritual events will be online: Wednesday meditation with Rev. Lori, Friday music mediation, Painting Meditation, yoga mediation and a Lenten study. Items in the box include, ashes, a worry knot, watercolor paints, palm cross and a calendar of kindness. We hope you will journey with us during these 40 days and look how God is on the Move.

Since more of us are able to be in the church again, the Helping Hands grocery cart is back in the commons area. If you wish to donate something, please



7th Grade – Audra Bell



We have heard stories from teachers through the years of her finishing her own work and then helping others unprompted, befriending new kids or those who seemed left out, and quickly coming to the aid of those needing help or support. We are deeply honored to have Audra recognized in a way that honors Luke's legacy.


