# God On the Move

Jesus didn't stay in one place for long. His journey was a physical movement towards Jerusalem but also a movement through human experience, encountering everything from temptation, to joy, to suffering and even death. As we encounter the life and ministry of Jesus, we cannot stay the same. We ourselves are moved to grow and change as followers of the gospel. The good news is that we are not alone. God is walking with us every step of the way.

Keep your eyes open to seeing God in our community. Where there is a need, people of faith can answer the call, "Here I am. Send me." We do this through acts of kindness and prayer. Lent is a time of personal transformation but it can also be a time of inviting others to experience God's transforming love and grace. Don't journey through Lent without inviting someone else to come with you.

We are offering easy ways to invite people through the arts: a watercolor painting meditation time, creating a blessing rock and putting it on a path to bless another person (side note: don't put the rock in a place that will trip someone but put it in a place where it will catch someone's eye). Invite someone to come to the prayer time on Good Friday. We will have a prayer labyrinth set up and cross where you can leave your cares and hurts. Our M&M group and Missions ministry team are partnering on Good Friday to create prayer tie blankets. You can come help tie these blankets that will cover someone in love.

Easter is the first Sunday of April. We will celebrate this as a faith community outside. One service is at sunrise and the second will be at 9:30 a.m. Because we are outside, we are not limited by the number as long as we use recommended precautions; distance and masks. Praise God from whom all blessings flow.

Continue to support our church with your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service and your witness. We are called to lead people to Jesus and help them grow as disciples.

#### **ROCK MEDITATION**

#### March 21 from 10:30am to NOON



You can bring your rock to church to be painted. We will have a paint station set up and Pam Parker will be our rock painting guide. It is our hope you will come and enjoy this in person activity for all ages.

Or you can do this at home.

This meditation may be performed as a way of perceiving the Divine within the physical universe or simply as a way of appreciating nature. In Jewish mystical tradition, stones have been referred to as "domemim" or "silent beings". Stones have the wisdom to teach us. They represent eternal knowing and remembering. The high priest wore twelve stones on his breast plate to remind the Holy One of the twelve tribes, and we place stones on a grave site in memory of the deceased.

Preparation: Choose a stone. It can be one that is either particularly beautiful, or unusual in your eyes. It could be a stone that represents a time or place you love. It could be a stone that came with your Lenten Box, that you might wish to paint and leave in the community as a Blessing Stone.

Sit comfortably with it, either inside or outside if the weather cooperates. You may want to have a small jar of water or oil with you. Begin with a wordless tune, a prayer to the Divine.

Feel in your body that you and the stone are both resting on the same earth. Holding your stone, or sitting in front of it, close your eyes and meditate on the stone without looking at it. Feel the silence.

Ending: When you open your eyes, you can offer a blessing to the stone. You can do this by saying words, by singing.

You can place the rock in a designated place in your home or return it to its natural setting.

#### **KAYAKING THROUGH CONFIRMATION CLASS**



# THURSDAY READING CIRCLE

On Thursday, March 11, the Reading Circle will be discussing *The Authenticity Project* by Clare Pooley.

Julian Jessop, an eccentric, lonely artist and septuagenarian believes that most people aren't really honest with each other. But what if they were? And so he writes—in a plain, green journal—the truth about his own life and leaves it in his local cafe. It's run by the incredibly tidy and efficient Monica, who furtively adds her own entry and leaves the book in the wine bar across the street. Before long, the others who find the green notebook add the truths about their own deepest selves—and soon find each other In Real Life at Monica's Cafe.

The Authenticity Project's cast of characters—including Hazard, the charming addict who makes a vow to get sober; Alice, the fabulous mommy Instagrammer whose real life is a lot less perfect than it looks online; and their other new friends—is by turns quirky and funny, heartbreakingly sad and painfully true-to-life. It's a story about being brave and putting your real self forward—and finding out that it's not as scary as it seems. In fact, it looks a lot like happiness.

The Authenticity Project is just the tonic for our times that readers are clamoring for—and one they will take to their hearts and read with unabashed pleasure.

# CHAPLAIN GAY CREDE'S STORY: LIFE IS A JOURNEY

The topic of a recent chapel exercise with Chaplain Gay Crede and a small group of boys from Cunningham's residential program was "Life is a Journey." She shared pictures of people hiking and walking through national parks and talked about how some parts of the journey were fun while others were scary. She then asked the boys, "What are three things you have discovered on your life's journey?"

The youth said things like, people care about me, I am loved, I believe in myself, I am forgiven, I am valued by staff. As they continued to talk, Chaplain Gay was delighted with the many responses that included the theme of "light at the end of the tunnel." The youth shared that even with the hardships and struggles they've experienced; they knew they were going to be okay. They could see the light ahead and have hope for a brighter future.

"They began to open up and recognize how a light at the end of the tunnel represented hope in a time of struggle," Chaplain Gay said. "While each of these boys are 14 or younger, they have all experienced dark times and past trauma. I am so thankful they are at Cunningham where they are cared for and can heal."



#### FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Dear Friends,

Pledged giving for the month of January was approximately \$42,000 and non-pledged giving was approximately \$14,000 making total giving about \$56,000. Total operating expenses were approximately \$25,000 generating net income for the month of over \$30,000. This represents a very positive financial start for 2021. The Illinois Great Rivers Conference required 2020 annual audit report and online reporting are on track to be filed before the March 1, 2021 due date.

I thank the congregation for their generous support of our church's mission.
