



APRIL: Joshua by Joseph Girzone When Joshua moves to a small cabin on the edge of town, the local people are mystified by his presence. A quiet and simple man, Joshua appears to

seek nothing for himself. He supports himself by working as a carpenter. He charges very little for his services, yet his craftsmanship is exquisite. The statue of Moses that he carves for the local synagogue prompts amazement as well as consternation.

What are the townsfolk to make of the enigmatic stranger? Some people report having seen him carry a huge cherry log on his shoulders effortlessly. Still others talk about the child in a poor part of town who was dreadfully ill but, after Joshua's visit, recovered completely.

Despite his benevolence and selfless work in the community, some remain suspicious. Finally, in an effort to address the community's doubts, Joshua is confronted by the local church leaders.

<u>Trustees Committee Update</u>

The fire suppression system with the nitrogen generator seems to be reaching a stable stage without the need for frequent service calls. The last of the water damage from the frozen pipe this past winter is in the final stages of repair by BluSky/Menold, with completion of drywall repair, painting, insulation and ceiling tile replacement expected to be completed by the end of the week. The Trustees with financial support from the Memorial Committee is replacing a 150-year church anniversary plaque by the swamp white oak tree planted east of the belltower outside of the turnaround. Memorial funds are also being used to replace one of our old drinking fountains with a water bottle filler/drinking fountain. Trustees are also looking at ways to repair/replace some of our non-functioning spotlights near the front of the sanctuary. Replacement lamps are becoming difficult to find for at least one type of our fixtures. Because some of these commercial spotlights are very expensive, we are looking for ways to repair existing fixtures or cut costs of new fixtures. Stacy Schroeder has taken leadership for the Naturescape playground improvement project, with design work in the early stages. It is anticipated that there will be numerous Eagle Scout project opportunities to help accomplish the renovation. The Trustees have begun the process of examining the possibility of our church purchasing a parsonage. The current townhouse being rented for Reverend Lori does not meet United Methodist and District requirements for accessibility, meeting spaces or parking. Because appropriate houses are in scarce supply the Trustees are consulting with local builders to examine costs for new construction using some of their existing designs. Before any property can be purchased, we will have to have a charge conference or church conference to get the approval of the congregation.

Finance Committee Report

Dear Friends,

Pledged giving for the month of February was approximately \$43,000 and non-pledged giving was approximately \$4,000 making total unrestricted giving about \$47,000. About \$12,500 in employer tax credits were also received during the month making total operating revenue \$58,000. Total operating expenses were approximately \$32,000 generating a net operating income for the month of \$26,000. In addition, two \$10,000 designated gifts were received. One for building repairs and the other for landscaping. Year to date operating income was about \$83,000 versus expenses of \$60,000. Thanks to the generosity of our church congregation, we are off to a great start in 2022.


