


Births this past Month




Children's Church

<u>Update from the Trustees, Parsonage Subcommittee and Parsonage Design Subcommittee</u> Submitted by G. Kling 5-22-2022

The Trustees voted to select Nelson Builders Illinois, LLC as the builder for our parsonage on April 27. Since that time, our committees have been working with Matt Nelson of Nelson Builders to flush out details of the proposed construction. We have also retained the services of Ms. Jenny Park, of Meyer Capel Law Office to handle legal matters relating to the purchase and titling of the property to ensure the tax-free status of the parsonage.

Since the congregational approval of the parsonage, two unsolicited donor families have come forth to help improve the functionality of the parsonage. Doug and Stacy Schroeder made a cash contribution that will allow a number of upgrades to the structure. The biggest upgrades have to do with accessibility. We will now be building a structure that will not have any steps to enter the house from the front and rear and from the garage. Since the parsonage is a congregational asset, it makes sense to build a low-barrier access house, not just in case we ever have a minister with accessibility issues, but more importantly, we will have a parsonage which will facilitate visits from church members who have certain physical disabilities. The changes to the structure also include widening certain doorways to bathrooms and bedrooms and adding an extra exit from the garage for safety. Doug Lape, a former home builder and member of the National Assn. of Homebuilders, and member of our parsonage design subcommittee, is donating a significant number of Decora electrical components for the construction. Other upgrades include adding a backup sump pump to the basement, insulating garage walls (since they will be dry-walled, this is our best chance to insulate them), changing from single-hung windows to double-hung, changing from white siding to either gray or tan to reduce maintenance, and changing to a harder grade of paint to facilitate wall cleaning. There are other possible changes still under discussion including the possible expansion of the house footprint to enlarge the dinette area by a few extra feet to improve its functionality. At this point in time, decisions concerning possible bathroom, bedroom or recreation rooms in the basement is still on-going, but is dependent upon donor funds. Any donated funds not utilized for construction will be used to reduce the amount borrowed for construction. Questions are welcome and can be directed to G. Finance Committee Report

Dear Friends,

Pledged giving for the month of April was approximately \$16,000 and non-pledged giving was approximately \$4,000 making total unrestricted giving about \$20,000. Total operating expenses were approximately \$33,000 generating a net operating loss for the month of \$13,000. The stock and bond markets had a difficult month, and this was reflected in the decline in value for MUMC investments at the United Methodist Foundation of about 5.5%. Year to date operating income was about \$132,000 (\$97K pledged giving, \$10K non-pledged giving and \$25K from employer tax credits) versus expenses of \$122,000.
