Effective stewardship ministry is never about the church's need to receive money. It is always about the giver's need to give. God wants each of us to experience the joy of generosity. Created in the image of our generous God, we are made to reflect God's generosity. And God calls us to become partners in God's work in the world through our gifts. As we grow in generosity, we grow in godliness and discipleship.

PLEDGING HELPS US EMBRACE THE SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINE OF GIVING.

Like prayer, scripture reading, fasting, and dedication to service, the practice of giving regularly and intentionally helps us grow in faith and mature spiritually. It serves as a continual reminder of God's claim on our lives. It requires us to put our own needs and wants into proper perspective, to set aside our own interests for the sake of God and others. Generosity is a tool God uses to shape our hearts. And through the spiritual discipline of giving, our hearts become one with God's heart and our faith grows. Pledging helps us embrace the spiritual discipline of regular, faithful giving.

PLEDGING HELPS US GROW IN GENEROSITY.

In their major study of the giving habits of American Christians, sociologists Christian Smith and Michael Emerson found that in every denomination studied those who filled out pledge cards contributed significantly more money than those who did not. Their evidence led them to conclude that the process of annual planning, deciding, and pledging as a structured means of regular, deliberate, and consistent financial giving itself influences giving to higher levels. Pledging helps us grow in generosity.

A PLEDGE IS A PROMISE BETWEEN US AND GOD.

Some people are afraid of making pledges because they fear being unable to fulfill them. But it's important to remember that neither a pledge nor an estimate of giving is a legally binding contract. A pledge is a promise between the giver and God shared with the church for the purpose of being more faithful, accountable, and generous. A pledge can be modified if someone's circumstances change.





OCTOBER 13: We Came, We Saw, We Left: A Family Gap Year by Charles Wheelan (290 pages)

What would happen if you quit your life for a year? In a pre-COVID-19 world, the Wheelan family

decided to find out; leaving behind work, school, and even the family dogs to travel the world on a modest budget.

Equal parts "how-to" and "how-not-to" — and with an eye toward a world emerging from a pandemic — We Came, We Saw, We Left is the insightful and often hilarious account of one family's gap-year experiment. Wheelan paints a picture of adventure and connectivity, juggling themes of local politics, global economics, and family dynamics while exploring answers to questions like: How do you sneak out of a Peruvian town that has been barricade by the local army? And where can you get treatment for a flesh-eating bacteria your daughter picked up two continents ago? From Colombia to Cambodia, We Came, We Saw, We Left chronicles nine months across six continents. What could go wrong?

Trustee Committee Report- update 9/26/22

The trustees have approved the purchase and installation of 3 new furnace/air conditioning units. The largest of these units provides heating and cooling to one-half of the sanctuary. The trustees approved the purchase of what is referred to in the trade as a package unit that combines heating and cooling in one outdoor box (like our current system). The trustees initially approved the purchase of this large unit from Lanz, Inc., but upon finding that we would not be able to receive the Trane unit until March or April, the order was cancelled, and we contracted with 217 to provide a similar unit manufactured by American Standard for \$17,150. That unit will arrive in approximately 2 weeks. We still have orders with Lanz, Inc. for the replacement of the furnace/air conditioner that provides heat and cooling to the south end of the education wing and for a unit that serves the Prayer room and surrounding areas. Those two units will be replaced at a combined cost of \$16,160. As we replace these units, we are doing so with high efficiency models that will help to control future energy costs. Our church is heated and cooled by 11 units. We replaced one unit in 2021 and thus we still have 7 furnace/air conditioner combinations that are original to the church. We thus anticipate additional heating and cooling replacement bills in the next few years. We currently have two gifts, totaling \$11,000, to help with the current expenses.

We are anxiously awaiting the initiation of construction on the parsonage. The building permit was listed in last Sunday's News Gazette and there are now marking flags on the lot from utility locating services. It thus appears that the project is about to start.

LATE BREAKING NEWS: Excavation for the parsonage began Tuesday, September 27th!

Finance Committee Report

Dear Friends,

Pledged giving for the month of August was approximately \$16,000, non-pledged giving was approximately \$4,000, and an employer tax credit from the IRS for \$8,000 was received making total unrestricted income about \$28,000. Total operating expenses were approximately \$33,000 generating a net operating loss for the month of \$5,000. Year to date operating income was about \$249,000 (\$196K pledged giving, \$19K non-pledged giving and \$34K from employer tax credits) versus expenses of \$256,000.


