Here's a great opportunity - Help us support ministry near and far. Our Christmas offering will be shared three ways: United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), Wooden It Be Lovely, and replacement of our church's HVAC units.

<u>UMCOR</u> provides assistance in places that have experienced disaster.

<u>Wooden It Be Lovely</u> offers hope and employment to women healing from lives of poverty, addiction, and abuse. They do this by providing transitional employment, mentoring, recovery tools, education, community networking, and a safe community.

<u>HVAC</u>: In the last 3 months we have paid over \$34,000 to replace 3 units. We have an estimate for \$30,000 to replace 3 additional units. There are 3 more units slated to be replaced in the next year for an additional \$35,000. They were all installed when the building was new and now we have seen them fail within a short time period.





New clients are asked to register and show proof of income and address when they come to the Center on the giveaway Saturday. Trustee Committee Report

Construction on the Parsonage is moving along steadily. The roof has been shingled, interior walls are framed, windows and most of the doors installed, the plumbing and HVAC has been roughed-in and the concrete driveway and sidewalk is complete. The reconstruction of South Mahomet Road is complete, along with the bike path, and the Village is working on finishing the ditch grading.

As heating season has gotten underway, we found three more furnaces with significant mechanical problems. These are in addition to the 3 we recently replaced earlier this fall. One had a cracked heat exchanger and the other two needed expensive repairs, leading to the recommendation by our preventative HVAC maintenance contractor to replace all 3 units. Since we also had two AC units of the same type and vintage fail earlier this summer, the trustees voted to replace all 3 furnaces along with their corresponding air conditioners striving for a minimum high efficiency SEER rating of 16. Like the previous units we recently replaced, the new AC units will be considerably more efficient than the units they are replacing. Two of the units have already been ordered and the availability of the third is being checked.

The fire suppression and alarm system continue to require our attention. The alarm system is being upgraded from a 3G cellular system to a 4G (upgradable to 5G). The nitrogen generator, which is part of our fire suppression system continues to require frequent maintenance.

Finance Committee Report

Dear Friends,

Pledged giving for the month of October was approximately \$20,000 and non-pledged giving was approximately \$4,000 making total unrestricted income about \$24,000. Total operating expenses were approximately \$41,000 generating a net operating loss for the month of \$17,000. Year to date operating income was about \$290,000 (\$230K pledged giving, \$26K non-pledged giving and \$34K from employer tax credits) versus expenses of \$342,000. Operating expenses are running higher than normal this year due to replacement of HVAC units, higher utility rates, and fire suppression system costs. Unfortunately, there are some additional HVAC units that are failing, and these will need to be replaced before year end.

The 2023 pledge cards are being returned and as of the end of October we have received 66 pledges for a total of approximately \$275,000. We expect to generate a few more pledges and will finalize our 2023 budget in December. I thank the congregation for this strong response. God's Work, Our Hands!






