







Trustee Committee Report

Trustees began the new year with elections. The following were elected: Gary Kling, Chair; Scott Yeazel, Vice-Chair; and Amy Roberts, Secretary.

Work on the parsonage is continuing, with the painting complete. Carpet, tile and the last few appliances have been ordered. The cabinetry is expected to be ready for installation in the first or second week of February. Lighting and window treatments are the last remaining things to be ordered. Completion of the house is still on track for the end of February.

We have been experiencing some pressure loss in our fire suppression piping due to corrosion in the pipes. Technicians from Matco Fire Protection, Inc. found 3 holes in the piping and installed temporary patches. Replacement of those sections of the pipes is tentatively scheduled for January 27 and will cost approximately \$2,500. Service technicians from 217, Inc. replaced a malfunctioning thermostat on the furnace on the west side of the sanctuary.

A failed compressor fan in the kitchen freezer was replaced by a technician from Frosty Refrigeration this past week and the freezer is now functioning properly.

The trustees are soliciting bids for some concrete work to create an ADA-accessible sidewalk from our parking lot to the sports pavilion/shed. The work will be paid for with a memorial gift given for that purpose.

Rev. Lori headed up trustee and finance efforts to apply for a grant from the Fellheimer Foundation to help defray the cost of the furnace and AC replacements/upgrades we made last year. The application was successful, and we received \$25,000.

Finance Committee Report

Dear Friends,

Pledged giving for the month of December was approximately \$25,000 and non-pledged giving was approximately \$7,000 making total unrestricted income about \$32,000. Total operating expenses were approximately \$23,000 generating net operating income for the month of \$9,000. The Christmas offering was just over \$3,000. Year to date operating income was about \$355,000 (\$275K pledged giving, \$45K non-pledged giving and \$35K from employer tax credits) versus expenses of \$411,000. Operating expenses were higher than normal this year due to replacement of HVAC units (\$61,000) and higher utility rates (\$7,000). Three additional HVAC units were replaced in early December. Thankfully, MUMC applied for a grant to help with these HVAC costs and \$25,000 was received in early January. 2022 was a difficult year for the operating budget as so many of the original HVAC units reached the end of their useful lives at the same time.

The 2023 budget has been approved at a condensed version of it is attached. I am hopeful revenues will exceed estimates and building related expenses will be more controlled in 2023. Our church needs to generate new members and we are back to full staff to support programs. I thank the congregation again for the strong pledge response. God's Work, Our Hands!

Education/Discipleship Committee

The Education/Discipleship Committee met Sunday, January 8, 2023 between services. This was the first meeting of the combined committees. It was decided that the Education and Discipleship Committees should combine, allowing the committee to design and offer a variety of Christian Education and outreach opportunities to all age levels, from toddlers to adults.

Our current offerings include five programs for children and youth:

Children's Sermon during the second service, Children's Church (Sunday School after the Children's Sermon), Toddler Time on Tuesday and Thursday Mornings, Come Play with Me, offered Wednesday morning, and Wonderful Outreach Wednesdays (WOW) afterschool on Wednesdays.

Soul Squad, our offering for church young people, will be taking a break. Our small group has lost members this spring due to sports and job commitments. We plan for it to resume in the Fall. In addition, we are planning for VBS to resume this summer at the end of June using a one-week format.

Adult Opportunities are now offered in two areas: Bible Studies and Support Groups.

A Women's Study, <u>Take Courage</u> (Study of Haggai), is offered Tuesday mornings. <u>Good Boundaries, Good Bye</u> by Lysa Terkeurst is offered every other Sunday evening via Zoom. <u>Twelve Ordinary Men</u> started last Sunday. This group meets between services on Sundays. <u>Discipleship Class is offering a Study of the New Testament meeting Monday evenings.</u>

In the area of support groups, one support group, Craving to Lose, is currently being offered Monday evenings. Our loss support program is under redesign. We hope to have it ready next fall.

The committee has chosen to meet the first Monday of the month at 7:00 pm as our usual meeting day and time. Therefore, our next meeting will be Monday, February 6th, 2023 at 7:00 pm in the church library. Please know that you are welcome to attend. I would like to acknowledge and thank this committee and our volunteers for their willingness to devote their time, resources, and energy to support our congregation (both young and old) as well as our community. Committee members and volunteers include: Kate Donahue, Kris Parker, Janet Thompson, Paula Burwell, Laurel Matthews, Chris Bunting, Stacy Schroeder, Joy Duitsman, Carly Irvin, Treva Bradd, Kathy Roush, Tony Early, Joyce Schmale, and John Schmale. A special thanks to Michelle Petty for envisioning many of these classes, and supporting this committee by arranging curriculum and leading many classes. If you would like to be a part of our programs, spending time with children, leading a study or support group, researching curriculum, or helping with Vacation Bible School, please know there are many opportunities available! Some volunteer opportunities are as simple as one or two hours midweek with toddlers or one hour per Sunday for Children's Church to many extensive programing opportunities!

FEBRUARY: Unlocking A Broken World by Scott and Connie Payne

When Scott and Connie Payne first arrived at Inner City Mission, they thought they had homelessness figured out. Soon, their beliefs collided with a world beyond their understanding. The solutions they offered – taken from America's playbook on poverty – failed to bring real answers. Everyone knows homelessness is about the lack of housing, jobs, and money, so why question it? Yet, after watching the same people fall back into homelessness, the Paynes had no choice. They had to find answers. To their amazement, the answers God provided came through unlikely people.

A remarkable novel about J.P. Morgan's personal librarian, Belle da Costa Greene, the Black American woman who was forced to hide her true identity and pass as white in order to leave a lasting legacy that enriched our nation. In her twenties, Belle da Costa Greene is hired by J.P.Morgan to curate a collection of rare manuscripts, books, and artwork for his newly built Pierpont Morgan Library. Belle becomes a fixture in New York City society and one of the most powerful people in the art and book world, known for her impeccable taste and shrewd negotiating for critical works as she helps create a world-class collection. But Belle has a secret, one she must protect at all costs. She was not born Belle da Costa Green but Belle Marion Greener. She is the daughter of Richard Greener, the first Black graduate of Harvard and a well-known advocate for equality. Belle's complexion isn't dark because of her alleged Portuguese heritage that lets her pass as white - her complexion is dark because she is African American. The Personal Librarian tells the story of an extraordinary woman, famous for her intellect, style and wit, and shares the lengths she must go to - for the protection of he family and her legacy - to preserve her carefully crafted white identity in the racist world in which she lives.


